SUBJECT: January 2015 Conservation Commission Tour and Interaction Dinner

On behalf of the Board of Supervisors and staff members of Clallam Conservation District, we invite you to attend a conservation project tour we will host on January 14, 2015. The purpose of the tour is to showcase a small cross-section of conservation projects we have undertaken, along with the Elwha River dam removal project.

We will begin the tour at the Olympic Lodge in Port Angeles (140 Del Guzzi Drive, Port Angeles, WA - <http://www.olympiclodge.com/>), starting at 12:30 PM. We will travel by bus about 17 miles east to Sequim for a tour of a low impact development demonstration project. The second stop will be Dungeness Bay to see the results of many years of water quality improvement work, as well as some planned habitat restoration projects. From Dungeness we will travel back to Port Angeles and up the Elwha River to learn about the recently completed dam removal project. After touring the Elwha, the buses will return to the Olympic Lodge for an opportunity to briefly freshen up before the Interaction Dinner.

The Interaction Dinner will be at the Cedars at Dungeness near Carlsborg, approximately 12 miles east of Port Angeles. The Cedars at Dungeness is a Jamestown S'Klallam Tribe-owned and operated golf course and restaurant. Buses will provide transport to and from the Interaction Dinner.

If you can't join us for the tour you can meet us for dinner. We will arrive at the Cedars at Dungeness about 5:45pm. Dinner cost is \$28.00 per person. Please bring cash or check made out to the Clallam Conservation District.

We will provide light refreshments during the tour. You can expect wet and cold weather in January, so please dress accordingly for the tour. We do not anticipate much walking, but there will be some standing around in the cold, so warm clothes and footwear are highly recommended.
